For example: "Pass legislation that increases the use of school vouchers" or "Reduce funding for the Department of Military."

Application-Based Office Questions:

- B) 1. If you are applying for **Sergeant at Arms**: There is one delegate speaking con on every bill, doing so in a way that is rude to the patrons. However, this delegate is the only one raising a placard for con speeches. What do you, as Sgt. at Arms, do?
